## Mental Health On-Call

(211 Mobile Crisis Unit): When a family has a child or youth in crisis, an immediate intervention can help get everyone back on track. **Dial 2-1-1 and request mobile crisis services.** A trained counselor will respond in less than an hour wherever help is needed. Crisis counselors work with your child and family to restore calm and connect you to the resources you need.
